The Lion!

"And one of the elders said to me, 'Stop crying!
Behold, the Lion that is from the tribe of Judah, the
Root of David, has overcome so as to open the scroll
and its seven seals." Rev. 5:5

When we see Jesus during His earthly ministry, we see Him described as a lamb. John writes, "On the next day, he saw Jesus coming to him and said, 'Behold, the Lamb of God who takes away the sin of the world!" Why is Jesus described as a lamb? We must go back to the Old Testament to answer that question.

When God rescued His people from Egypt, He commanded His people to slay a lamb without blemish and take the blood and place it on "two doorposts and on the lintel of the houses in which they eat it" (Exodus 12:7). The blood of the Lamb's sacrifice would save the people from God slaying their firstborn male child.

In Exodus 29, God set up the sacrificial system and commanded that the priests would slay a lamb every morning and evening. These daily sacrifices, like all others, were to point people toward the perfect sacrifice of Christ on the cross. The Lamb's blood showed the need for a blood sacrifice to atone for man's sin. When Jesus was crucified, He became the perfect sacrifice, and His blood paid the penalty for every believer's sins. He came as a Lamb. He will return as a Lion.

The first time He came, He humbled Himself and was humiliated, reviled, and crucified at the hands of sinful men. When He returns, He will bring God's judgment upon the wicked. One reason the Jews rejected Christ is that they were looking for a conquering King, not a lamb, to take away the sins of the world. When Jesus returns, He will set up His earthly kingdom and rule with a rod of iron (Rev. 2:27). One day, Christ will return, and every knee will bend, and every head will bow. The wicked and the righteous will all bow. John MacArthur writes,

"Those who will submit to the supreme authority of Jesus Christ will comprise three groups. First will be those who are in heaven, which will include the holy angels and the saints, the redeemed believers of all ages. That heavenly group, of course, has long been worshiping Jesus Christ as Lord (cf. Heb. 1:6; 12:23; Rev. 4:8–11; 5:8–14). The second group will be those who are on earth, both redeemed and unredeemed. The redeemed will continue their worship of Him that began when they were saved. The third group who will worship the exalted Lord will be those who are under the earth, the fallen angels and unredeemed dead who are awaiting final judgment and eternal punishment."

Do you know Jesus as the Lamb who took away your sin? Is He your Lord and Savior? If not, you will face God's wrath. One of the most frightful passages in Scripture warns you what awaits if you refuse to believe that Jesus is the Messiah, "Then I saw a great white throne and Him who sits upon it, from whose presence earth and heaven fled away, and no place was found for them. Then I saw the dead, the great and the small, standing before the throne, and books were opened; and another book was opened, which is the book of life. And the dead were judged from the things which were written in the books, according to their deeds. And the sea gave up the dead which were in it, and death and Hades gave up the dead which were in them, and they were judged, every one of them according to their deeds" (Rev. 20:11-13).
